



2020 FIREARMS AMNESTY: 6 STEPS TO HANDING IN YOUR GUN

(1 August 2020 to 31 January 2021)

IDENTIFY YOUR UNIQUE SITUATION OR SCENARIO:

I have a valid licence/permit/authorisation under the Firearms Control Act

My licence/permit/authorisation has expired

I have a green ID licence under the Arms and Ammunition Act

I inherited a gun and haven't licensed it

OR

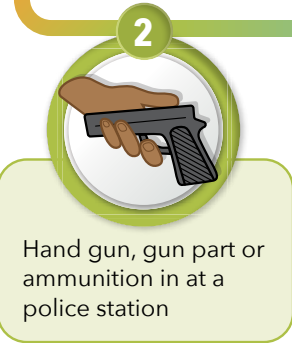
A family member who is ill/ disabled has a gun but is not in a position to safely use it and cannot hand it in themselves



Take your ID and applicable documents
e.g. licence, permit or authorisation with you to police station

Take your ID and applicable documents
e.g. death certificate, letter of appointment as executor/curator with you to police station

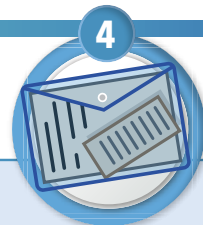
Contact your local police station, who will safely collect the firearm and ensure the necessary forms are completed.



Hand gun, gun part or ammunition in at a police station



- Complete SAPS 522(a) and (b) forms (Surrendering and Forfeiture of a firearm)
- Receive a copy of SAPS 548 (Acknowledgement of receipt)



- Keep a copy of all documents handed in and forms completed
- Record date and time, and name and rank of the police member helping you
- Take note of name, rank and contact details of police station's Designated Amnesty Official



No compensation will be paid to any person who surrenders a gun for destruction during the 2020 Firearms Amnesty



Call your local Designated Amnesty Official to get an update on the status of your firearm/s or to confirm that your gun has been destroyed and official records updated
